June Recap

While I didn't get to vote, because I knew too much and talked too much. It was a blind tasting of Australian wines, all selected from the AWS provided candidate list, and obtained by Alex Grandinetti of College Square Liquors (Thanks much Alex!). Each wine was bagged, the whites chilled, and the reds breathed at least 30 minutes. Scoring was done before the speculation and final reveal of each wine. After the flight, votes for favorites were cast for each, except the starter, the Black Box Australian Chardonnay, which was way too dark and flabby for my blood. Then the prices were revealed, and I had somehow mixed them up in my presentation, but the correct prices are shown below with my apologies! The National Tasting Project turned out like this:
